- 1. Bureaucracy can never be an excuse for inaction

 - RENEW is a great role model for organizational innovation- especially in times of rapid modernization.
 - Thank you, Your Majesty, and RENEW for breaking through that cultural and Red Tape Resistance in 2004.
 - The people you have helped since 2004 are a testament to your couragelong may ye continue your great work.

2. Paro Valley is a special teacher- especially for Bhutan and the whole Himalayas

- This Paro College of Education with its 835 students is a premiere institution in education.
- But Paro Valley is most truly inspirational as a centre for compassion and learning because of Kichu Lakhang and Taksang.
- Chenrezig is the great inspiration to combine heart and mind
